CFA KEYNOTE SPEAKER Thursday October 17 at 5:30pm, Concord Free Public Library

2024 RUTH RATNER MILLER MEMORIAL AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN AMERICAN HISTORY

Saturday, October 19 at 7pm, Goodwin Forum, Concord Free Public Library

This year's Miller Memorial Award will be presented to Concord resident Jacqueline Jones, Professor Emerita, Ellen C. Temple Chair in Women's History, and Mastin Gentry White Professor of Southern History at the University of Texas at Austin. As an American social historian, Jones has authored several books, including most recently, *No Right to an Honest Living: The Struggles of Boston's Black Workers in the Civil War Era* (2023), winner of the 2024 Pulitzer Prize in History. The Miller Award is named for Dr. Ruth Ratner Miller, who believed passionately that understanding history was not merely desirable, but a civic and religious duty. *This free event is presented by the Friends of the Concord Free Public Library*.





Natalie Dykstra

Author Natalie Dykstra will give an illustrated talk on her new book *Chasing Beauty: The Life of Isabella Stewart Gardner*. An extraordinary achievement of storytelling and scholarship, *Chasing Beauty* illuminates the fascinating ways the museum and its holdings can be seen as a kind of memoir, dazzling and haunting, created with objects instead of words and displayed per Isabella's wishes in the exact placements she initially curated. Dykstra is also the author of *Clover Adams: A Gilded and Heartbreaking Life*, which won a National Endowment for the Humanities Fellowship.
